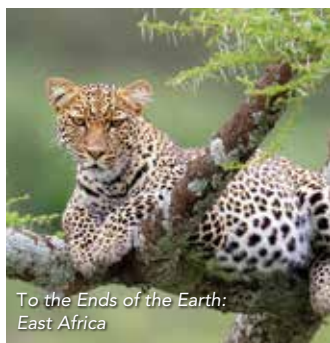


## Follow the Water

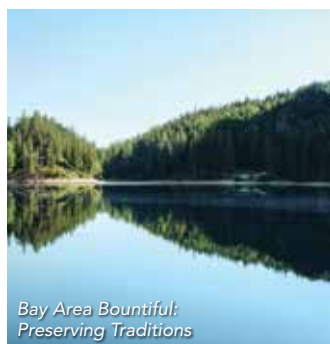


## To the Ends of the Earth: East Africa
